## T3 Week 5 Lessons 1&2

- Use the correct metalanguage to improve character profiles and Chapter summaries
- Ponder over the questions with many answers.

- What imagery is associated with the 'ash heaps'?
- How do the 'ash heaps' function as a motif?
- What are the differences between the representation of the 'Eggs' and New York? (Think about the stuff that happens in each place, the descriptions of how each place looks, the people that inhabit each place.)
- What oppositions can you think of that this text sets up?
